

School Uniform Policy

All students are expected to wear appropriate school uniform as published and look neat and tidy. They must wear black, fully enclosed formal shoes; trainers are not acceptable. Students are also expected to maintain an appropriate level of personal hygiene. Primary class teachers will make regular uniform checks during registration periods. If teachers find that a student is persistently not wearing the correct uniform, parents will be contacted and asked to bring the correct uniform in to school. The following should be noted in particular:

- Jewellery of religious significance may be worn by students by discretion of SLT. Otherwise no jewellery, except for a watch and one small stud earring in each ear lobe for girls only, may be worn to school. Boys may wear a simple stud in one ear only. No other piercings are permitted. Visible tattoos are forbidden.
- Make-up and nail polish may not be worn in school
- For both boys and girls, socks should be plain black or white in colour,
- Hairstyles should not exceed those that meet with normal social acceptance. Students' hair must be of a natural colour rather than bright, obvious or 'unnatural'. Hairstyling products can be used to style hair in a neat and tidy manner providing it is presentable and acceptable for a place of work. It is the school's decision on what constitutes appropriate.
- Long hair (hair that touches the shirt collar) is to be tied back with school regulation hair bands. This applies to boys and girls.
- Girls wearing skirts should ensure they are below the knee.
- Shoes must be flat, heels are not acceptable.
- All uniforms, bags, water bottles etc. need to be clearly labeled with child's name and class. Children **may not** use trolley-bags/ suitcase on wheels for school. Bags must be of a size to fit inside lockers. Un-named lost uniform not claimed from the lost property will be handed over for re-sale.
